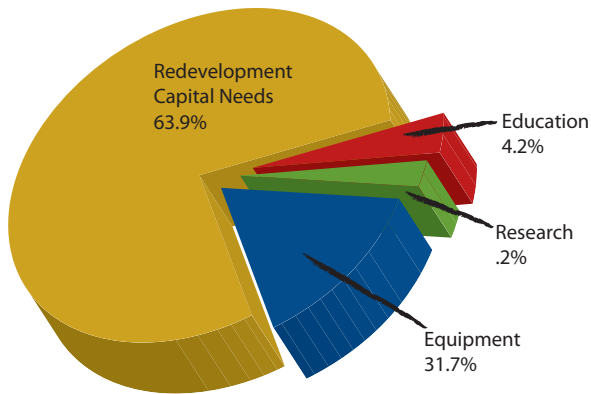

## Thank you, because Together We Did!

We've done it; we have surpassed the \$70 million *Together We Can* campaign goal, thanks to the generosity of our community. The campaign total has now reached \$71.5 million!

Together, donors from Kingston and communities across Southeastern Ontario have committed the funds needed for the local share of the redevelopment plan for all three university hospitals of Kingston – Hotel Dieu Hospital, Kingston General Hospital and Providence Care.

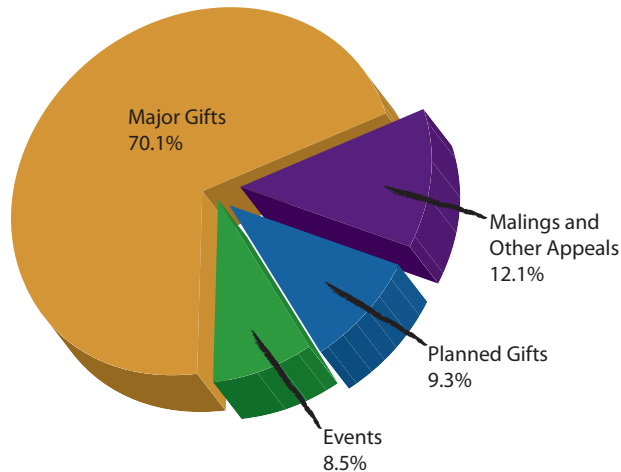


Your gifts to the campaign have ensured new and expanded health care facilities at Kingston's three hospitals. You've helped improve services for the more than 500,000 people in Southeastern Ontario who depend on our hospitals.

## Your Gifts Added Up!

**Every gift we received moved us toward our goal**

- »Fourteen municipalities across the region served by Kingston's three teaching hospitals collectively donated \$20 million dollars
- »83 donors made leadership gifts of \$100,000 or more
- »500 community (third party) events have raised more than \$3.5 million
- »More than 35,000 people made gifts in response to mailings which totaled more than \$8.5 million
- »Almost 23,000 individual donors chose to make a gift to the hospitals for the first time
- »103 donors provided planned gifts from their estate



# Look What's Been Accomplished! Your donations at work.

Your gifts to the *Together We Can* campaign provided the community share for redevelopment projects at all three Kingston hospitals. Your donations to education have helped hospital staff attend conferences and seminars in nursing, cardiac care, and leadership, and also funded scholarship and bursary programs for individuals. Contributions for equipment have funded the purchase of equipment such as: Alaris Pump Modules for the Emergency Room, an ECG Cart, a Powerspin Centrifuge, a Stress Echo Bed, Vital Signs Monitors, an Optical Coherence Tomography unit and a Vivid 7 ECHO System for pediatric cardiac patients.

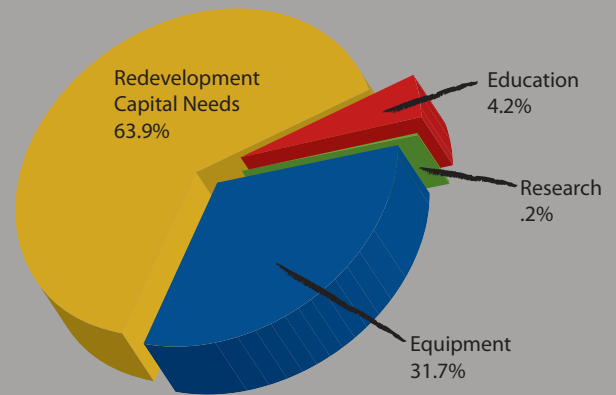
## At Hotel Dieu Hospital

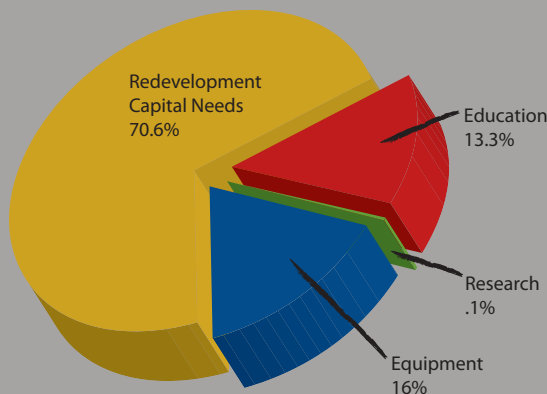
The hospital is redeveloping 36,000 square feet of existing space to create new generic clinic suites on two floors, a new urology clinic, a new Pulmonary Function Testing Lab and a new elevator tower. When the redevelopment project is completed, Hotel Dieu will house most of the remaining specialized ambulatory clinics currently located at Kingston General Hospital. This translates into at least 50,000 new patient visits annually, as well as more efficient use of clinic space, personnel and equipment.



## At Providence Care

The Ontario government has approved plans to build a new hospital, to replace the aging Mental Health Services and St. Mary's of the Lake Hospital facilities. The site of the new hospital will be very close to where Providence Care's Mental Health Services is now located, at King Street West, adjacent to Lake Ontario Park.

Current plans are for the new hospital to include 270 inpatient beds, as well as numerous outpatient services. Providence Care will provide specialized mental health, rehabilitation, palliative care, specialized geriatrics and complex continuing care programs at the new facility.

## At Kingston General Hospital

The expansion and renovation redevelopment project at Kingston General Hospital, to create an additional 170,000 square feet of space and update another 143,000 square feet, is almost 90 percent complete. Fully completed units include the: new inpatient pediatric unit located on the new Kidd 10; new medicine and inpatient oncology unit one floor below on the new Kidd 9; first of three phases to expand and renovate the intensive care unit (ICU); new expanded in-centre dialysis unit; and the new cancer outpatient unit.

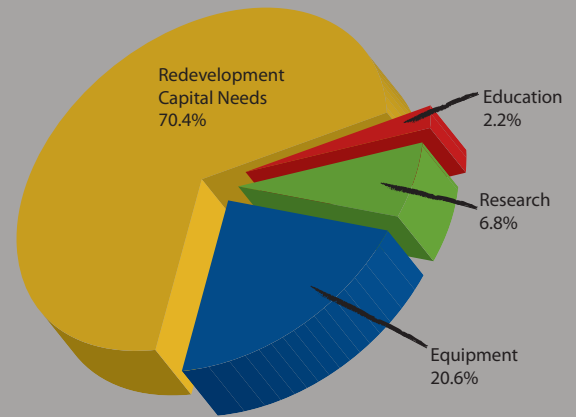
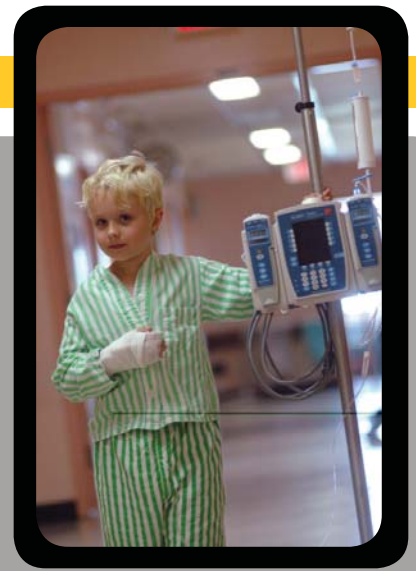

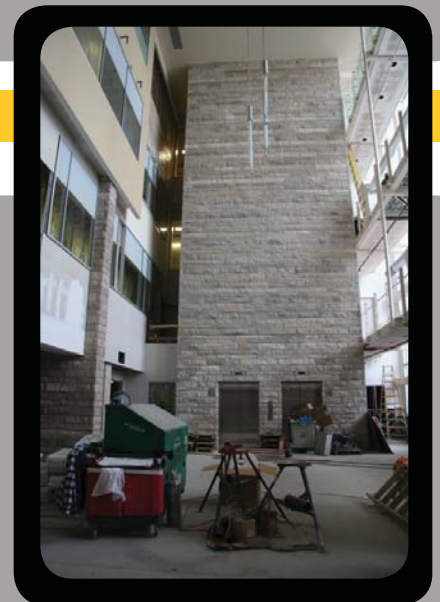
## At the Cancer Centre of Southeastern Ontario

Expansion and renovation of the Cancer Centre of Southeastern Ontario will almost double the overall size of the cancer centre from 54,445 square feet to 91,085 square feet, and will provide patients with an environment that will enhance privacy and dignity. The new space is being constructed on three levels of the Burr wing and the outpatient clinic has been completed. Other new space will include: two new radiation bunkers to increase treatment capacity and a specialized clinic area for pediatric oncology patients. The Burr wing galleria is also taking shape. The airy space includes a limestone floor-to-ceiling elevator bank and a new entrance off of King Street that will feature an awning-style roof and patient drop off area.
